Society Improves the War of 1812 Monument in Blandford Cemetery at Petersburg

The War of 1812 Society in the Commonwealth of Virginia on April 16, 2016, in the Blandford Cemetery in Petersburg, added eight names to the War of 1812 monument they had erected in June 2013 listing ninety four veterans of the war interred or memorialized there. Thus the total names on the monument now is 102. This was done in conjunction with a ceremony unveiling a monument erected adjacent to the War of 1812 one, listing nineteen Revolutionary War patriot burials. Now visitors to the cemetery upon arriving in the Visitor Center Parking lot, may view the names of the patriots of both the first and second War of Independence interred or memorialized there.

In addition, the display area was widened and a pole and a permanently displayed American flag was mounted between the two monuments. This was accomplished in an unveiling ceremony conducted by the Richmond Chapter, Virginia Society Sons of the American Revolution.
