





HEATH, James Ewell was born 08 Jul 1792 and died 28 Jun 1862. He served as a Lieutenant in the 36th Virginia Militia Regiment in Captain John Linton's Troop of Calvary, Prince William County. This unit served in August and September 1814. He married 21 Sep 1820 at Fairfield, Prince William County, Elizabeth Ann Macon, who was born in 1801 and died in1860. He was the son of John Heath and Sarah Ewell. He was editor of American Literary Messenger and author of book, *Edge Hill*, a novel about the American Revolution. He was also Auditor of the Accounts of the State of Virginia. Sources: Stuart L. TATE, Joseph; was born in1796 in Richmond and died on 27 May 1839. He served as a Private in Captain William Neely's Company from Kanawha Co (now WVA) that was attached to Virginias 7th Regiment from 10 August 1814 to 22 February 1815 at Norfolk. He received bounty land for his service. He married Margaret Riley on 02 Jan 1812 in Frederick County who received a pension for his service as Margaret Horn in Winchester, VA. She died on 31 Apr 1883 in Palmyra, Ohio, Missouri. After the war he was Mayor and Chief Magistrate of the city from 1826 to 1839. WHITFIELD, Richard: was born 12 Sep 1777, in Whitby, North Yorkshire, England and died 04 Aug 1866. He served as a Private, in Major Stapleton's Detachment from the 16th Virginia Militia Regiment of Spotsylvania County and was in battle at Hampton when the British occupied the city on 25 Jun 1813 Next he served in the 32d Virginia Militia Regiment in Captain Briscoe G Baldwin's Company of Mounted Infantry, in Augusta County, attached to Lieutenant Colonel's McDowell's Flying Camp which served on near the Potomac River at Aquia Creek at Camp Selden and then moved to Camp Fairfield on the James River 29 Sep 1813 to16 Jan 1814. He married Ann Booker, who was born 26 Sep 1792, and died 21 Sep 1846. He was a businessman in Richmond after the war.
