The Grand Union Flag was the *first true flag of the United States*, since it was authorized by the 2nd Continental Congress in 1775 as the official flag of the 13 colonies when they declared independence from England on July 4, 1776. It remained in use throughout the 1st year of the War of the American Revolution.



The Star Spangled Banner Flag got its name because it was the flag that flew during the War of 1812 in Baltimore, where Francis Scott Key wrote our national anthem, "*The Star Spangled Banner*," during the British attack on Fort McHenry there.
