John L Rowe, Jr as Mayor of Portsmouth, VA in a proclamation from his office gives special appreciation to the War of 1812 Society in the Commonwealth of Virginia for honoring fourteen War of 1812 veterans interred in the Trinity Episcopal Church cemetery. The names along with eleven Revolutionary War patriot are on a plaque unveiled that is mounted on the entrance wall to the church.

Proclamation

Whereas. Portsmouth and its residents since the early 1600s have made important contributions to the history and economic development of our region, commonwealth, and nation; and

Whereas, the Chesapeake, one of six frigates authorized by Congress, was launched at Gosport in 1798; and

Whereas, the encounter of Chesapeake with the British frigate Leopard off the Virginia Capes in 1807 was a cause of the War of 1812; and

Whereas, the Town of Portsmouth and Gosport Navy Yard narrowly averted capture and destruction when a large British force was defeated at the Battle of Craney Island on June 22, 1813, due to the gallant defense of the Virginia militia, regular troops, and seamen from the U. S. Constellation under the command of Brigadier General Robert Taylor of Norfolk, with a role played by the Portsmouth Light Artillery commanded by Captain Arthur Emmerson of Portsmouth.

Now, Therefore, 9. John L. Rowe, Jr., Mayor of the City of Portsmouth, Virginia, do hereby proclaim June 1, 2019 as

"A Day of Celebration and Grateful Remembrance"

to honoring the eleven Patriots of the American Revolution and the fourteen veterans of the War of 1812 interred in the Trinity Episcopal Church cemetery, and to give special appreciation for the recognition given by the War of 1812 Society in the Commonwealth of Virginia in observance of the sacrifices and dedication of the Americans who successfully defended the United States of America in the War of 1812.

In Witness Whereof, and on behalf of the Portsmouth City Council, I hereunto set my hand and caused the Seal of the City of Portsmouth to be affixed this first day of June, two thousand nineteen.
