Murray Forbes: He was born on 04 July 1782 in Dumfries in Prince William County, son of Dr David & Margaret (Sterling) Forbes. His mother was the daughter of the Last Laird of Herbershire, England. He married 22 Jun 1815, Sally Innes Thornton, born 11 Jan 1799 and died 07 Feb 1886. She drew a pension for his service in the War of 1812. He served in the War in Captain Thomas C. Alexander's Company in Stafford County on 14-16 July 1813 and again during the period 22 July to 17 August 1814. He drew a pension and bounty land for his service while residing in Orange County. He died on 30 July 1863. His son James F. Forbes was killed in the Civil War in the same volley of fire that wounded General Stonewall Jackson.





James Henderson Fitzgerald: He was born in December 1786 in Nottoway County, Virginia. He served as a Private in Captain William Fitzgerald's Company in Nottoway County. This Captain William Fitzgerald undoubtedly was an older relative of his and perhaps his father.. This unit was ordered to the defense of Norfolk and while there from August 1814 to January 1815 was attached to the 4th Virginia Regiment commanded by Lt Colonels Huston & Woodings. He married in 1810 Elizabeth (_____) who was born in 1793 and died on 18 February 1881. He died while in Paris, France thus this is probably a memorialized gravestone in the cemetery.

Francis Thornton: He was born on 11 June 1767 on Fall Hill in Fredericksburg. He is a grandson of the Francis Thornton interred in this cemetery. He married on 20 June 1792, Sally Innes, daughter of Judge Henry Innes and Elizabeth Callaway. He served as a Sergeant in Captain Benjamin Coles Artillery Company of the 5th Virginia Regiment in Culpeper County with duty from 19 March to 29 May 1813 in the attached unit of Lt Colonel John H. Cocke in Camp Randolph located on the James River in the defense of Richmond. He received a survivor's pension for his War of 1812 service. He died, 15 July 1836 while residing at White Sulfur Springs in Frankfort, Kentucky, thus he is probably only memorialized in this cemetery. After his death his wife Sally received a widow's pension
