The War of 1812 Society in the Commonwealth of Virginia plans five grave markings for 2014

These grave markers, plaques or monuments that will be unveiled in ceremonies to honor War of 1812 veterans interred in Virginia are open to the public. Especially invited are descendants of the veterans.

Following these listings are more details regarding each event.

May 3 2014 Ware Episcopal Church in Gloucester County: Two 1812 veterans, John Dixon and Catesby Jones will have grave markers unveiled in conjunction with the Thomas Nelson Jr Chapter, VA Society SAR who will honor Revolutionary War patriots as well

May 17 2014 Old Donation Episcopal Church in Virginia Beach: Three War of 1812 veterans. John Henderson, Anthony Walke, and John Brownley will be honored in addition to a Virginia founder and several Colonial and Revolutionary War veterans. The ceremony will be conducted jointly with several other lineage societies.

<u>June 7 2014 Blandford Cemetery, Petersburg</u>: Ninety four War of 1812 veterans whose names are inscribed on a monument will be honored. The ceremony will be in conjunction with the National Society U.S. Daughters of 1812

<u>June 14 2014 Dumfries Public Cemetery, Prince William County</u>: Nine War of 1812 veterans will be honored in conjunction with eleven Revolutionary War patriots with their names being inscribed on a monument. The ceremony will be conducted with the Virginia Society Sons of the American Revolution.

At a date to be determined at the Masonic Cemetery in Fredericksburg: Seventeen War of 1812 veterans and nineteen Revolutionary War patriots will be honored with the unveiling of a sign or plaque at the cemetery with their names listed. The ceremony will be conducted with the Virginia Society Sons of the American Revolution.


