1812 Veterans

BARGER, John: He was born in 1794, and died in 1845. He was married to Anne Culley, who was born in 1795 and died in 1858. He served as a Private in the 2d Corps de Elite commanded by Colonel Moses Green. Information on his service may be found at the National Archives in roll box number, 10 record 1466.

COINER, Michael: He was born in 1790 and died in 1864. He was married to Catharine Koiner who was born in 1797 and died in 1866. He served as a Sergeant, in Captain Link's Company, Second Corps d'Elite, commanded by Col. Moses Green. Information on his service can be found in the Virginia Militia in the War of 1812, from the Rolls in the Auditor's Office at Richmond, Vol. 1, Pay Roll page 220.

COYNER, Jacob: He was born in 1789 and died in 1874. He was married to Elizabeth Michael, daughter of George Michael, and she was born in 1796 and died in 1878. He served as an Ensign in the Fifth Virginia Militia Regiment commanded by Colonel McDowell. Information about his service may be found at the National Archives in roll box 40, record 772.

KOINER (Coyner), John: He was born in 1792, and died in 1852. He was married to Jane C. Mowry who was born in 1802 and died in 1830. He served as a Corporal in the Fifth Virginia Militia Regiment commanded by Colonel McDowell. Information about his service may be found at the National Archives in roll box 48, record 773.

COYNER (Koiner), Phillip: He was born in 1777, and died in 1849. He was married to Catherine Faber, and he served as an Ensign in the Fifth Virginia Militia Regiment commanded by Colonel McDowell. Information about his service may be found at the National Archives in roll box 48, record 774.

STICKLEY, Gabriel: He was born in 1791 and died in 1836 and was married to Rebecca Keller. She was born in 1792 and died in 1873. He served as a Private in Captain Fry's and Captain Sloan's companies of the Fourth Virginia militia Regiment. Information about his service may be found at the National Archives in roll box 200, record 26154 and Index to War of 1812 Pension Files, Vol. 2, J-Z, Page 1658, by Virgil White.
