The Society of the War of 1812 in the Commonwealth of Virginia participated in a joint plaque unveiling ceremony with the Virginia Society Sons of the Revolution that lists War of 1812 veterans and Revolutionary War patriots memorialized or buried at the Pohick Episcopal Church cemetery in Lorton,

Fairfax County on July 29, 2017
