BOARD OF DIRECTION MEETS ON FEBRUARY 11, 2022, AT THE OMNI HOTEL, RICHMOND, VIRGINIA



The Board of Direction of the Society of the War of 1812 in the Commonwealth of Virginia had its February meeting at the Omni Hotel, Richmond, Virginia. The Board met in conjunction with the Virginia Society of the Sons of the American Revolution (VSSAR) as has been the custom for some time.

At 10am President Paul Walden called the meeting to order Officers who were present provided the latest developments in their area of responsibility. According to the Treasurer's report, the Society is on sound financial foundation. Despite the lost of some members who decline to continue as members and several deaths, the Society has 155 members. Among topics discussed were upcoming grave marking events in conjunction with the VSSAR, costs associated with new

plaques for graves and historical markers, and the establishment of a data base listing burial of War of 1812 veterans in Virginia. The Society's school essay contest was extended to June 20, 2022, and an increase in the first and second place winner was increased to \$1000 and \$500 respectively. Once again, the Society is planning to hold its annual muster at the Westwood Club in Richmond, Virginia on June 25, 2022. A grave marking ceremony will follow. Details will follow. The Society will observe a grave marking event at the final resting place of Presidents John Tyler and James Monroe on March 29 and April 28, 2022, respectively, at Hollywood Cemetery, Richmond, Virginia. All members are urged to attend these events. The Fall meeting's time and place will be determined later but likely to be in northern Virginia.

A slate of new nominees for Society's officers was put forth for nomination by the Nominating Committee (Stuart Butler and Thad Hartmann) and was approved by the Board of Direction. The new officers will take office effectively on June 25, 2022. They include James Green, President, IVice President, Kenneth Hawkins, 2nd Vice President Dale Corey; Secretary James Russell; Treasurer, Shane Newcombe; Registrar, Hugh Markham, Counsel Carter Furr; Historian Peter Broadbent; Chaplain Thad Hartmann and Vice President General Paul Walker.

Thad Hartmann, chaplain, gave the benediction and the meeting was adjourned at 11:57 a·m
