Biography of First Lieutenant Dr. James Carson Natalie Ardoline President - Eliza Monroe Chapter

At this time the 1812 Veteran Marker will be unveiled by Dr. Carson's descendants.

We gather to pay tribute to Dr. James Carson who served our great country as a First Lieutenant in the War of 1812 as well as a physician, businessman and dedicated community servant in Alexandria. He was born in Ireland in 1773, immigrated to Alexandria in 1805 with his wife Ursula and his two brothers Nehemiah and George, joining their father Dr. Samuel Carson who is buried here next to him. He was the father to three children, Elizabeth Carson Roach, Jane Carson Gahan and Samuel B. Carson Captain in the Army of Texas. Dr. Carson was a First Lieutenant Alexandria Artillery Company, member of the Alexandria Dragoons, a Commander with the Friendship Fire Company for 19 years, Superintendent of Police and Inspector of the City Docks 9 years, Attendant to Gen. Lafayette in 1824, Manager and Vice President of the Hibernian Society of Alexandria 16 years, Justice of the Peace 9 years, member of the Alexandria Board of Health, and in 1842 as a Manager of the Birth-night Ball honoring Gen. Washington. He served the citizens of Alexandria until his death in 1855.

We now lay wreaths in grateful recognition of his sacrifice and service and pay tribute to all the heroic men and women who have served our nation.

Erected in memory of Dr. JAMES CARSON A native of the country of Armagh Ireland who died September 9th, 1855 in the 82d year of his age also his wife URSULA a native of county Armagh Ireland who died June 3rd 1835 in the 53d year of her age **OBITUARY.** The death of Dr. JAMES CARSON, has been already announced in the Gazette. He was native of Ireland, but emigrated to this country, in early life, and lived in this city and beighborhood ever since. He was an active citizen, as long as his health permitted, and filled in this place, several offices of trust and filled in this place, several offices of trust and filled in this tellow townsmen. He was a warm heated, patriotic gentleman; and had many friends. Kind in all the social relations, intelligent, and urbane, his companionship was sought after by the young, as well as by those of his own age. As time advanced he withdrew from the active scenes of life, and passed the evening of his days calmly and quietly, at the midence of his son in law in this county. He died at a ripe old age, with the respect and estem of all who knew him, and who will long theis bis memory and the recollections of his miny estimable qualities of mind and heart.
