EVENT AT MONTPELIER, VIRGINIA, March 16, 2024***

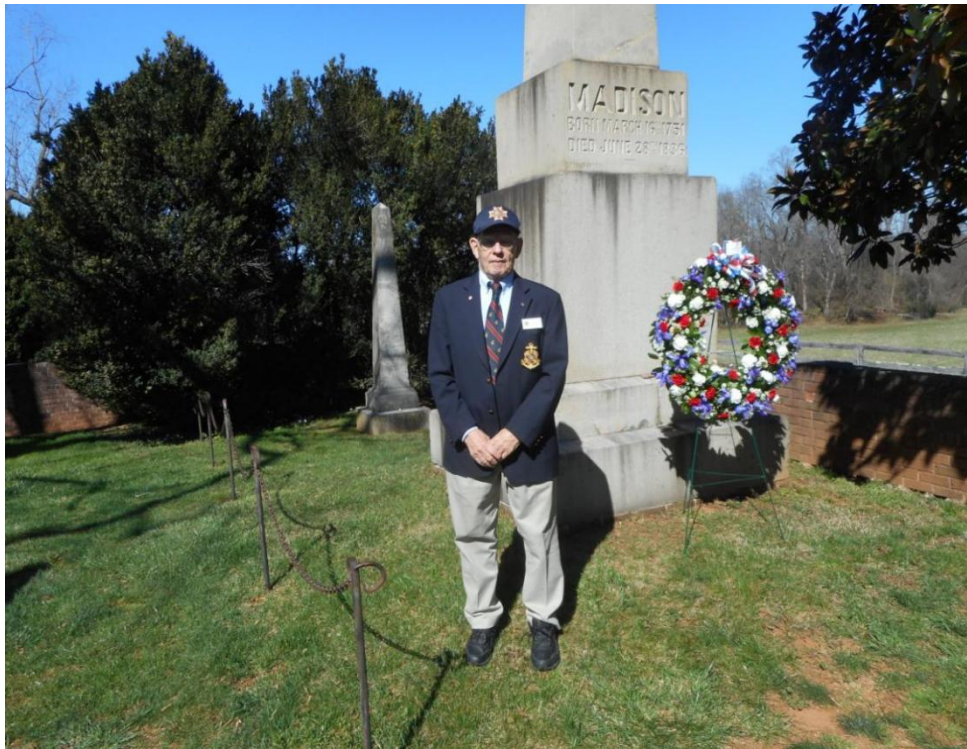
